## Indian Markets Look Set To Surge To Record Levels In The New Year's First Full Trading Week

US stock markets navigated a holiday-shortened last week marked by early volatility and net weekly losses despite intraday recoveries.

Indian stock markets demonstrated resilience throughout the holiday-thinned week, closing higher on low volumes driven by year-end positioning.

Optimism was fuelled by robust GDP growth (8.2%), strong automotive sales, encouraging updates in the banking sector, anticipation of Budget 2026, and expectations of favourable US trade deal.

Asian equities reached record highs as investors extended their positioning in technology stocks. Oil prices fluctuated while precious metals gained.

The Trump administration launched what it termed a "large-scale strike against Venezuela," capturing President Maduro to face criminal charges. Trump announced the US will administer Venezuela until a "safe, proper, and judicious transition" can occur. As we expected in our Annual market strategy, crude oil is likely to remain subdued through the year on a gradually rising supply.

MSCI's Asian stock index surged 0.7% at the open after a closely watched technology gauge reached an all-time high. US equity-index futures also rose as Asian trading commenced following the Venezuelan president's ouster, creating a fresh geopolitical flashpoint.

Nifty has decisively breached previous swing-high resistance levels at 26,236 and 26,325, confirming a decisive breakout from its prior consolidation range. With the index now in uncharted territory, near-term upside targets extend toward 26,500 and beyond. Immediate support has shifted higher to approximately 26,100, likely providing a near-term floor during pullbacks.

As expected, FPIs have begun covering their short positions in index futures.

	<b>Bank of Baroda</b>	Global business up 12.2% YoY at Rs 28.9 lakh crore. Global deposits rose 10.3% to Rs 15.5 lakh crore, while domestic deposits grew 11% to Rs 13.1 lakh crore. Global advances increased 14.6% to Rs 13.4 lakh crore, and domestic advances rose 13.5% to Rs 10.9 lakh crore. Domestic retail advances were up 17.3% at Rs 2.9 lakh crore.
	<b>Sobha</b>	Realty firm posted its highest-ever quarterly real estate sales, achieving a total sales value of Rs 2,115 crore in Q3 FY26, up 52.3% from Rs 1,389 crore in Q3 FY25 and 11.2% from Rs 1,903 crore in Q2 FY26. Sobha's share of the sales value reached Rs 1,818 crore, representing 85.9% of total sales. The quarter saw new sales covering 1.37 million square feet, with an average price realisation of Rs 15,436 per square foot. The company launched its first project in Mumbai, Sobha Inizio, marking its entry into a new city.
	<b>V2 Retail</b>	The company's standalone revenue rose 57% YoY to Rs 927 crore during the December quarter. The growth was supported by steady demand across its core markets and continued focus on expanding its physical retail footprint. Same-store sales growth was at 2% on a year-on-year basis, indicating stable performance from its existing stores despite a challenging consumption environment in parts of the retail sector.

## Key Events

### **Trump says second Venezuela strike possible if government does not cooperate**

US President Donald Trump said that the United States might launch a second military strike on Venezuela following the capture of President Nicolas Maduro if remaining members of the administration do not cooperate with his efforts to get the country "fixed."

Trump's comments to reporters aboard Air Force One raised the possibility of further U.S. military interventions in Latin America, and suggested Colombia and Mexico could also face military action if they do not reduce the flow of illicit drugs to the United States.

Maduro is in a New York detention center awaiting a Monday court appearance on drug charges. His capture by the United States has sparked deep uncertainty about what is next for the oil-rich South American nation.

Trump said his administration will work with remaining members of the Maduro regime to clamp down on drug trafficking and overhaul its oil industry, rather than push for immediate elections to install a new government.

### **China services activity expands at slowest pace in 6 mths in Dec**

China's services sector expanded in line with expectations in December, although growth slowed slightly as weaker demand conditions and continued job cuts weighed on activity toward the end of the year, a private sector survey showed.

The RatingDog Services PMI eased to 52.0 in December from 52.1 in November, in line with market expectations and remaining above the 50-point mark that separates growth from contraction.

While the reading extended the sector's expansion streak to three years, it also marked the slowest pace of growth in six months, highlighting persistent fragilities in the recovery.

### **Japan's factory activity steadies as demand declines slow, PMI shows**

Japan's manufacturing activity stalled in December as demand declined at a slower pace from the previous month, a private-sector survey showed, ending a five-month streak of deterioration.

The S&P Global Japan Manufacturing Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) was flat at 50.0 in December, improving from 48.7 in November and hitting the break-even point separating expansion from contraction.

The decline in new orders in December was the softest since May 2024, the survey showed. Although many firms noted subdued demand, some saw sales had improved, underpinned by new projects and stronger-than-expected customer spending.

### LONG BUILD UP WAS SEEN IN THE BANK NIFTY FUTURES

#### Create longs with the SL of 26350 levels

- Nifty extended its winning streak for the third consecutive session, rallying 182 points to settle at a fresh record high of 26,328. After a mildly positive start, index steadily gained momentum through the day, hitting a new peak of 26,340 before closing near the day's high. .
- Short Covering was seen in the Nifty Futures where Open Interest fell by 1.36% with Nifty rising by 0.70%.
- Long Build-Up was seen in the Bank Nifty Futures where Open Interest rose by 5.70% with Bank Nifty rising by 0.74%.
- Nifty Open Interest Put Call ratio rose to 1.46 levels from 1.13 levels.
- Amongst the Nifty options (06-Jan Expiry), Call writing is seen at 26500-26600 levels, indicating Nifty is likely to find strong resistance in the vicinity of 26500-26600 levels. On the lower side, an immediate support is placed in the vicinity of 26300-26400 levels where we have seen Put writing.
- Short covering was seen by FII's' in the Index Futures segment where they net bought worth 2,359 cr with their Open Interest going down by 8604 contracts.

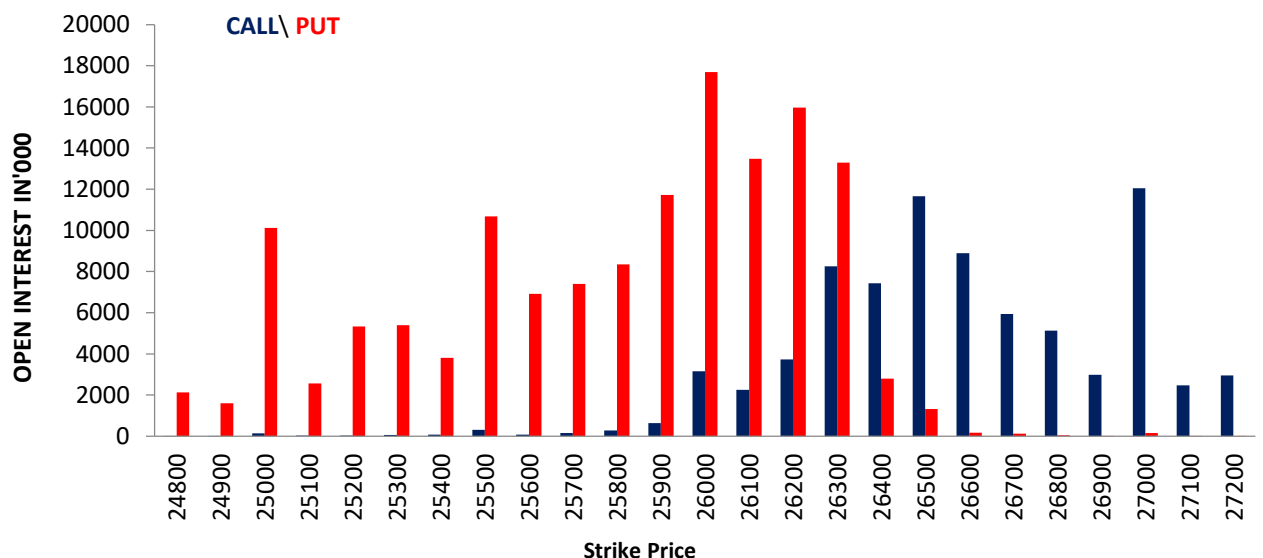
